ECD Network had an opportunity to participate on a regional webinar named Kurasa which is founded in Kenya. The webinar showcased conversations that detailed who ECD network is, what the network stands for and called to all listeners to share abstracts for the 5th national ECD stakeholders conference scheduled for 17th - 19th July 2023. Kurasa is an acclaimed educational podcast show that is an innovation of young scholars whose interest is children. The Programmes Liaison Officer, Sally Moraa got to participate in the discussion of nurturing care in ECD.



Kiambu county & Nairobi county CIDP Stakeholders forum

The ECD Network for Kenya was privileged to participate in the Nairobi and Kiambu Counties' education and health CIDP development respectively. Kenya has successfully transitioned governments through its general election as witnessed in the month of August 2022. Counties have since embarked on aligning their plans and budgetary allocations for the various development projects. Kiambu and Nairobi Counties held a review meeting with implementing partners on the County Integrated Development Plan (CIDP). This was to align the projects they are implementing with the President's and Governor's Manifestos.



The Nairobi CIDP development team entailed the following sub - sectors from department of education. These included Early Childhood Development sector, Community Development, Gender and Disability sector and Children/Family & social services sector. In addition to Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) implementing in Nairobi County.

The county Economic and planning team guided the Education department sub sectors on the steps that would be adopted in development of the 2023 - 2027 CIDP. These steps included; a) Preliminaries; this is where the economic team develops concept note, circular, formation of steering Committee and sensitization to various departments, b) Data collection and analysis; where review of the previous CIDP takes place to identify the baseline situation, c) development of objectives and strategies; this entails vision, mission, objectives, outcomes and targets of the CIDP, d) programmes and projects that the departments proposes to implement for the 5 years, e) drafting of the combined CIDP, f) validation through public participation, g)adoption and approval, h) launching and dissemination. The previous CIDP (2018-2022) acted as a feedback tool on how the county managed funds and achieved the set targets.







This was achieved through reviewing of sector specific performance to determine the level of achievements. At the end of the workshop, a draft CIDP was developed and shared with the County Economic and Planning department. This would later be combined with other CIDPs from other departments like health. The combined document would later be shared to the public for validation.

ECD Network for Kenya was privileged to be invited by the two counties to join various stakeholders implementing in the counties to share their views on development plans for the county and interrogate the plans laid by the counties.

Ministry of Health TWG for children aged (5-10 YRS)

The ECD network for Kenya joined stakeholders in the Ministry of Health forum that was focusing on provision of services for children aged 5-10 years. This was a gap identified that needed urgent attention from service providers. The age cohort has been forgotten and there are no programmatic interventions targeting this cohort hence leading to limited data addressing the needs of these children. Research conducted by Clinical Information's Network (CIN) and Kemri indicate that these children (5-10yrs), have experienced high morbidity and mortality as gathers from inpatient data. As a result, MoH found need to form a TWG to discuss the need and development of guidelines addressing the need of these children.

Technical working groups is one of the ideas Kenya has embraced to combat the issue of stakeholders working in silos as a sector. The technical working groups are led by government and include representation from the non-governmental stakeholders.



The nurturing care technical working group hosted by the ministry of health is one of the many technical groups in existence in the country. ECD network for Kenya as a member of the group joined members to share on the state of nurturing care in the country. The meeting is among the quarterly scheduled meetings set to share reflections, progress and ideas of scaling the work being done by both government and non-governmental stakeholders

This was the order of the day for the ECD network secretariat who had an opportunity to host the BRAC team from Pakistan. The team was part of an expedition team sent to various organizations in Kenya who are doing great innovations in children's sector. This visit was coupled with innovative ideas on how best the two organizations can learn from each other and areas of partnership in the near future.
