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# Introduction: Child population in Kenya (KNBS 2019)

## Status of Child Development in Kenya (KDHS, 2022)

Indicator	Percentage
Children 24-59 months not developmentally on track	21%
Children under 5 stunted	18%
Of the 18% children stunted, those living in rural areas	20%
Children stunted living in urban areas	12%
Children stunted in lowest and highest wealth quantiles	28% & 9% respectively
Children stunted from mothers with no/low education and those with secondary school education and above	20% & 9% respectively

## Objective and project phases

 Overall goal to develop an actionable ECD systems measurement framework, and collect monitoring data on policy, governance, multi-sectoral coordination, and financing at the subnational level in Kenya. Project had two phases:

### Phase 1: had 2 tasks involving:

- Kick off meetings, desk review
- Designing evaluation & measurement framework (systems actors and indicators mapping, developing theory of change).

## Phase 2: had 2 tasks involving:

- Baseline data collection both secondary & primary, processing and report writing.
- Dissemination of findings.




## Systems indicators on governance

Three systems indicators were used to measure governance 2 focusing on capacity building of frontline workers and 1 tracking Nurturing Care implementation.

- Number of pre-primary teachers trained on SECD/CCD
- Number of HCWs trained on SECD/CCD
- Number of county departments tracking implementation of nurturing care components

## **Findings: Capacity Building**





A total # of 18,093 health workers from 19 counties trained between 2021 and 2023. This equates to an average of 953 health workers trained per county.

**Training areas** included; child development, nutrition, maternal and child health, and maternal, infant, and young child nutrition.

**Teacher training focused on upgrading teacher qualifications** and **implementing CBC**, the training did not focus on nurturing care for child development.

Total **number of teachers trained 37,077** from 20 counties 2021-2023

## **Findings**

- Multi- sectoral coordination: Lack of publicly available documents on multi-sector coordination.
- Four counties had structures for multi-sectoral coordination, including dedicated departments responsible for fostering partnerships and facilitating coordination efforts (Siaya, Nairobi, Mombasa and Kajiado).
- **Finance:** 47% of the counties had costed ECD activities for three target departments (Health, Education, and Children Services), 38% had costed activities for two departments, and 83% had costed activities for only one targeted department.
- Budgeting in the department of health is program-based, with no specific budget lines ring-fenced for children below five years, indicating a lack of targeted budget allocation for ECD within

### Conclusion/Recommendations

#### **Enhance Governance Commitment:**

- County governments to demonstrate stronger commitment to supporting NC for young children by prioritizing the development of the NC skillset of preprimary teachers and health care workers
- There is a need to encourage counties to allocate resources for training and professional development in these areas
- Counties should invest in data systems to enhance availability of evidence on ECD systems monitoring

#### Strengthen Multi-Sectoral Coordination:

- Promote sharing of best practices and coordination models among counties to improve multi-sectoral cooperation for ECD
- Encourage development of publicly available documents that outline coordination mechanisms and responsibilities among ministries and stakeholders involved in ECD is critical for enhancing multi-sectoral coordination

#### **Structured Financing Mechanism:**

/ Establish a dedicated and ring-fenced budget for ECD at both the national and county levels



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
