INVESTMENT IN ECD BY THE GOVERNMENT AND HOW TO LOBBY FOR RING FENCING OF BUDGETS AND STRATEGIES ON HOW TO COORDINATE INTRA/INTER DEPARTMENTAL ON ECD.

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A HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE TO ECD

Child care as a household and community concern; the child belonged to the community.

- Changes including- settlement, urbanization, livelihood, absentee parents, mental health, deprivation and increased seclusion.
- Changes in local governance; less communal care, collapse of traditional leadership.
- The role of teachers and religious institutions
- The role of households and the community in dispute resolution (to the disadvantage of children), FGM, child labor and denial of basic rights





A HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE TO ECD

- Compartmentalization of government action on children (national and decentralized level)
- ✓ Child-health services
 - Pre and postnatal services
 - Immunization
 - Nutrition
- ✓ Home economics
- ✓ Water and Sanitation Services
- Education services
- ✓ Day care services
- Registration service
- ✓ Children service
- ✓ Criminal actions
- ✓ Parenting services
- Culture, the community and child welfare (dispute resolution, FGM, child labour and access to basic rights)





INVESTING IN ECD BY GOVERNMENT

Before 2013

- Critical role NGOs and the civil society
- The role of children's officers; administer/ arbitrate/ prosecute complaints regarding child abuse, school fees, etc
- Negligible investment in early childhood education
- Birth registration and children not registered at Class 8 and at 18
- Limited government intervention through the District Development Committee system and the CAP 265 local governments
- Devolution is barely 11 years (inclusive of the 3-year transition phase) but often equated to a 60 year old National Government.







THE CONSTITUTION OF KENYA AND ECD

- Childcare is a localised issue, best
 administered by the level of
 government closest to the
 people; county government
- The Bill of Rights; foundation of ECD.
- Article 20 (1) on application of the Bill of Rights that binds all State Organs
- Article 21 (1) on the duty of the State and 21(3) on the duty to address the needs of vulnerable groups, including children

- Article 260 defines the State
- Article 43 on Economic and Social Rights
- Article 53 on the Rights of Children
- Majority of the Rights of Children are County Government functions.
- Articles 179 and 185 on the executive and legislative authority of the county government
- Article 186, and Part 2 of the Fourth Schedule on the functions of the County Governments





THE CONSTITUTION OF KENYA AND ECD

Article 203 (3) on the need to ensure that finances allocated to County Governments are sufficient for them to perform the functions allocated to them:

a. Costing of functions not yet done

- ECD(E) is not as a factor in determining the horizontal allocation of funds to County Governments. Current formula:
 - ✓ 0.20* Basic Share Index
 - ✓ 0.18*Population Index
 - ✓ 0.17*Health Index
 - ✓ 0.10* Agriculture Index
 - ✓ 0.05*Urban Index
 - ✓ 0.14*Poverty Index
 - ✓ 0.08*Land Area Index
 - ✓ 0.08*Roads Index





THE CONSTITUTION OF KENYA AND ECD

- Article 200 provides for the County Governments Act that provides for the Planning framework for the Council Governments
 - CGA Section 106 (2) provides the basis of County plann based on the 4th Schedule and on relevant national policies
 - CGA Section 107 CIDP, Sectoral Plans, Spatial Plans. These the primary county planning tools, including urban plans urban authorities.
 - ✓ CGA Section 108. Planning to be based on data and GIS
- CGA Section 109 Sectoral Planning. For example, Early Childh Development Sector
- The Public Finance Act provides the framework for budgeting, including the budget cycle







- Enhanced advocacy to institutionalise County Governments as DUTY BEARERS
 - Demystify ECD and lessen the latent tension between National and County Governments on ECD
 - Review the Childrens Act, including Sections 54,55,61,62 to align with Articles 179 and 185 and the Bill of Rights
- Resource allocation as a political process
 - Leverage on responsibilities and powers of the County Governor (the convening power and common voice of Council of Governors) and the County Assembly as entry points.
 - ✓ Leverage on the devolved functions; Schedule 4.
 - Equal thrust with the G7 (Women) Strategy; G47 ECD Strategy
- Anchor budgeting in the County Planning and Budgeting process
 - ✓ Provide evidence (data) and technical support for mainstreaming.
- Lobby for an education index in the revenue sharing formula.
- Advocate for costing of functions and then ring-fence
